

# Do you know about The Masonic Conversation Group?

Most Masons have been faced with the same dilemma when they were pondering whether Masonry was something for them or not: 'Yes, I am interested in it, but I don't know much about it. The Masons I know cannot really tell me what it is all about; they say: you have to experience it for yourself.' (Hint: don't Google it, you will be thoroughly disappointed. Because you have to experience it for yourself. Just like life.)

We understand this dilemma (because, as I said, most of us experienced it ourselves).

But the dilemma works both ways: Freemasonry can only thrive on a constant influx of new blood, new ideas, new enthusiasm. So it benefits us to open our doors to new candidates, to be accessible. But as we also believe that new brothers should join out of their own free will, without any pressure from our side, we are limited in our options to `recruit' new candidates.

Therefore Tucson Lodge #4 offers the 'Masonic Conversation Group':

In a relaxed, friendly setting we give interested men the option to discuss why they would like to join, what their uncertainties and expectations are, what (if applicable) their current relationship with Freemasonry is (e.g. having family members that are Masons) etc. These sessions are always led by one or more 'experienced' Masons, who are more than willing to answer all questions and to share what joining Masonry meant for them on a personal level. It is our experience that not only do the potential candidates get a flavor of what Masonry is about, but also get to know each other. So if/when they decide to join, they may already have befriended potential future brothers.

The Conversation Group gets together every Wednesday evening, at 7:00 pm, in the library of Tucson Lodge #4, except on Stated Meeting nights (first Wednesday of the month). Also there may be no meetings during the summer months. On Stated Meeting nights the group's attendees are invited to have dinner with us from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm (that's when the Meeting starts).



# From The Secretary




For those of you who were not at the January stated meeting, I read the minutes for the January 1922 stated meeting. Yes, you read that correctly, NINETEEN TWENTY-TWO – 100 years ago. At that time, the lodge was even more active than we are today. A major item of business, and very significant in the masonic history of Tucson, was the lodge's approval of a request to form another lodge as well as to issue demits for 14 of the founding members. This lodge became the one we know today as Epes Randolph #32.

I am in the process of scanning all the petitions and supporting documentation (demits, perpetual membership certificates, and such) of our active members and uploading them into Grand View. This is at the request of the Grand Secretary. This will also allow me to answer questions about a brother without having to wait until I get down to the lodge to dig through the paper files.

I will also be scanning in all our past minutes and at the same time, putting them in better binders and labeling as such. With the recent fires in numerous masonic temples, it is important we take steps to protect our history. We already have all the Past Mater pictures scanned through 2019 and I want to do the same with the minutes. Our lodge and member records are stored in fire resistant cabinets, and we do have sprinklers in the building. Another advantage in scanning the minutes is we can refer to them without taking the risk of damaging them. When we have paper that is more than 100 years old, you can see why we need to be careful in handling them.

Now for my Public Service Announcement – if you haven't paid your dues, please do so. If you need help, please let either the Worshipful Master or myself know so we can help. As of this writing (Jan 14<sup>th</sup>) we have 53 brothers who have yet to pay their dues. I would love to have a summer where we are not tracking down brothers to pay dues.
