We have a couple of our brethren who may be, I can't promise or reveal their names to get in their EA degree proficiency (Open, Confer and Close).


### From the East continued


I thank you all for the support the lodge has shown me in the last, almost, two years. It's been an enjoyable experience, thanks to you, the members of this lodge.



As usual any discussion you would like to have with me regarding any of this I am interested in and open to



For now, on the masthead and on page 4 I placed some examples of Tracing Boards.




Two Tracing Board Examples. According to one website many of these have been lost and existing ones are therefore valuable.

From the Secretary

Ah, yes, the month of October, when we see the light at the end of the tunnel for the masonic year and await the oncoming train which is the next year. I have finished compiling the list of our longevity award recipients for our Awards Night on October 19<sup>th</sup>. If he can make it, we will be presenting an extremely rare award – 75 years. From my research in the archives of the lodge, this will be first of this kind. In the past we had a couple of 70s, but never a 75. There will be a meal of some sort beforehand and the festivities will start at 7:00 pm.

At the September stated meeting, we suspended 2 brothers for non-payment of dues, something I really, really dislike doing. Dues for 2023 will remain the same - \$122 (\$127 if paying via PayPal). Out of our 232 members, roughly 160 pay dues, the reminder are our Senior Life, Regulation 19, and Perpetual members. Dues notices will go out the first part of November and I dues cards shortly thereafter. I do not know when we will receive our dues cards from Grand Lodge as we haven't been asked on how many we will need yet. At the risk of the wrath of the treasurer, I will start taking 2023 dues payments whenever you give them to me.

Sometimes the role of a secretary is that of a detective. We have five brothers who I still cannot track down. I have access to several search engines

and other sources for finding them. But my best source is **YOU**. There are times when you need to contact me with changed, added, or removed information. The following are examples of that information:

- 1. When you move, in or out of state
- 2. When you change your telephone number (cell or home)
- 3. When you change your email address
- 4. When you join another lodge (in or out of AZ)
- 5. When you Demit or withdraw from another lodge (in or out of AZ)

Better yet, you can update your address and contact information in Grandview yourself (if you have activated your account). If you would like help in setting up your account, please let me know.

We had a great time at the Gaslight Theatre in August, and I am looking at setting up another trip in the spring once I get the spring schedule.
