



Mention it is your masonic birthday month and get a free meal at that month's stated meeting.

Subduing our passions! Why would we want to do that? Two definitions of "passion" are; intense enthusiasm, and, an outburst of emotion. Artists (musicians, painters, dancers) are enthusiastic about their craft and often reach the pinnacle of their specialties. Outbursts of emotion may range from: an expression of love for a subject or another person, to negative expressions of rage, hatred or self-righteousness.

I believe Freemasonry encourages enthusiasm, and that our professed desire to subdue our passions refers to the suppression of negative outbursts of emotion and actions resulting from those negative outbursts. Given the complexity of the human psyche, about the best we can hope for is that we eventually "learn" to subdue our passions. If an individual cannot or does not progress in "learning", then they do not deserve to be called a Mason.

Improving myself in Masonry. It is important to note that it says, "Improving myself", not that someone else is going to do it for you. What does "in Masonry" refer to, we are all familiar with the three basic tenets of Masonry, Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. Let's take these in reverse order.

Truth refers to universal truths, not what an individual regards as their "truth". Truth does not require an adjective, no opinion is required regarding the validity of a truth, and snarky comments do not diminish the acceptance of a truth, e.g. "Yes, it is true that


X=Y, if you believe that sort of thing"! If it is true that X equals Y, an individuals' denial of that fact does not make it less true.

Relief may be defined as "freeing someone from anxiety". That anxiety may be the result of mental, physical or financial issues. It is the duty of every Mason to relieve other individuals, particularly a "Worthy Brother", so far as they can do so without serious injury (mental, physical or financial) to themselves. Relief can range from, "Would you like to talk", to "Can I help you move", to "Could you use a couple of bucks"?

Brotherly Love. This might require an entire book to start to define. A few specific definitions from the dictionary are; kindness, respectfulness, concern, tender affection, and fraternity. I encourage each of you, my Brothers, to ponder these attributes, because if we cannot practice Brotherly Love, we are ignoring the first tenet of Freemasonry and therefore have failed our individual commitments as a Mason.




