



# From The Secretary



I am in the process of closing out the year and would like to share some numbers with you. We started 2022 with 236 members. We had 5 pass to the Celestial Lodge above, lost 2 to suspension for nonpayment of dues, and 5 to demits/withdrawals. On the plus side, we raised 3 new master masons, and had 3 join the lodge via affiliation. As of December 28<sup>th</sup>, we had 230 members on the books. When we subtract out our 46 Perpetual Members, 21 Senior Life Members, and 10 Regulation 19 Members (relief) that leaves us with 153 dues paying members. We pay per capita on our dues paying and Perpetual members and this year it looks like the amount will be right around \$7500. There are also fees for each degree we confer, petitions we elect, as well as affiliations from outside of Arizona. This will amount to an additional \$700 plus or minus. These numbers are not exact, I and will have the final figures once I close out my secretary's forms with the Grand Secretary. Now you see why I sometimes sound like a broken record on paying your dues. As of today, we have 59 brothers who have yet to pay their dues and they were due on December 31<sup>st</sup>. If you haven't paid them, please do so. If you need help with your dues, please let either me or WB Sam know so we can help. We have a lot of tools at our disposal.

The Worshipful Master has a very active year planned and, in a few days, we will be posting a copy of this year's schedule on the bulletin board. We are going back to the Gaslight in April and hopefully again in August. I urge every brother to help and support WB Sam in his year. And for those of you making New Year's resolutions – how about this one – Attend Lodge! (and if you can't—call up a brother who you haven't seen for a while and ask how he is doing).
