

"The truth is that masonry is undoubtedly a religious institution. Its religion being of that universal kind in which all men can agree." -Albert Mackey

Hello from the south! The quote above is an interesting one. It comes from Albert Mackey himself. More often than not we see reality under a bias lens. That is we tend to see things as they relate to us individually. Our personal experiences, likes and dislikes tend to distort things as they actually are. We rely on the angles in which we see things more often than we should. I would venture to say this is counterintuitive to what we are really supposed to do in freemasonry.

The reason I picked this quote is because it reminded me of a conversation I once had with an older mason. During this conversation this mason proclaimed confidently that "Freemasonry is a Christian organization". "The Religion of Freemasonry is not Christian" -Albert Mackey.

The name of the exact paper escapes me at this moment but this dissertation from the 1700s stated very clearly that the lodge was shared with men of all religions. "But Masonry teaches, and has preserved in their purity, the cardinal tenets of the old primitive faith, which underlie and are the foundation of all religion. Masonry is the universal morality which is suitable to the inhabitants of every clime, to the man of every creed." -Albert Pike




